WATER TREATMENT PLANT REFURBISHED TO IMPROVE WATER QUALITY



The Dr Beyers Naude Local Municipality has been grappling with severe drought conditions, with the Nqweba Dam reaching a critically low level of 0% over the past few years and dependent on groundwater sources. In response to this challenge, the Municipality initiated plans for the refurbishment of the Graaff-Reinet drinking water treatment plant. Subsequently, comprehensive business plans were developed and submitted to the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS), which were approved. This approval provided the necessary funding for the commencement of the project, which coincided with a period of substantial and consistent rainfall contributing to Nqweba Dam levels current 101 % full of capacity.

Findings:

The primary objective of the refurbishment project was to address mechanical, electrical, and civil work at the drinking water treatment plant. The scope of the refurbishment included the following key components:

- 1. Inlet Channel and Telemetry: The refurbishment of the inlet channel and telemetry aimed to optimize the intake of raw water into the treatment process, ensuring efficient and reliable water supply to the plant.
- 2. Clarifiers: The refurbishment of clarifiers focused on enhancing the settling and separation of suspended solids from the water, thereby improving the overall treatment efficiency.
- 3. Sand Filtration: This component involved the refurbishment of sand filtration systems, essential for removing impurities and particles from the water, contributing to an enhanced water quality output.
- 4. Chlorination/Disinfection: Refurbishment of the chlorination and disinfection systems was crucial to ensuring that the treated water meets the required safety and quality standards for public consumption as per SANS 241.
- 5. Blower, Main Pump Station and Clear Well: The refurbishment of the blower, clear well and main pump station was undertaken to improve the overall operational efficiency and reliability of the water treatment process.
- 6. Building: Refurbishment of the existing infrastructure and buildings aimed to create a conducive and safe working environment for plant personnel, ultimately contributing to the overall effectiveness of the treatment operations.



7. Safety and Security Systems: The project also encompassed the enhancement of safety and security systems within the plant premises, ensuring the well-being of personnel and the protection of critical assets.

Conclusion:

In summary, the refurbishment of the Graaff-Reinet drinking water treatment plant represents a vital initiative undertaken by the Municipality to address the challenges posed by the drought and to ensure the provision of safe and reliable drinking water to the residents. The successful completion of this project significantly enhanced the operational capacity and resilience of the treatment plant, ultimately benefiting the community at large.




