ICROP EVENT: ADDRESSING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN WARD 1 AND 7 OF DR. BEYERS NAUDÉ MUNICIPALITY

On the 13th of November 2024, a significant ICROP (Integrated Community Outreach Program) event took place in Aberdeen, focusing on the pressing challenges faced by the communities in Ward 1 and Ward 7 of the Dr. Beyers Naudé Municipality. The event brought together the honorable MEC for Social Development, Ms. Bukiwe Fanta, and various stakeholders, including community leaders, healthcare professionals, social workers, and residents.

The household profiling exercise revealed critical data about the prevalence of malnutrition among children under six. The profiling identified the socio-economic factors contributing to malnutrition, including unemployment, lack of access to nutritious food, and inadequate healthcare services. The findings underscored the urgent need for targeted interventions to support these families.

Community Dialogues

Community dialogues held in the lead-up to the event provided valuable insights into the lived experiences of residents. Themes such as food insecurity, youth unemployment, substance abuse, and inadequate access to healthcare and social services were highlighted. These dialogues emphasized the importance of community involvement in co-developing solutions.

Direction for Services

Based on the profiling and dialogue feedback, the event concluded with recommendations for action:

- Nutritional Support Programs: Expanding feeding schemes and providing nutritional supplements for malnourished children.
- Healthcare Access: Enhancing mobile clinic services and increasing outreach programs to address gaps in healthcare provision.
- Skills Development: Implementing vocational training and employment initiatives for youth and caregivers.
- Community Wellness Initiatives: Strengthening substance abuse programs and promoting mental health awareness campaigns.

Commitment and Way Forward

The MEC, Ms. Bukiwe Fanta, commended the collaborative efforts of all stakeholders and reaffirmed her department's commitment to addressing the challenges faced by these communities. She emphasized the importance of continued engagement and the need for innovative, sustainable solutions to uplift the residents of Ward 1 and 7. The event marked a pivotal step in driving integrated and community-focused development. Stakeholders pledged to work collectively to ensure that the recommendations are translated into actionable plans that will yield tangible improvements in the lives of residents.

As the ICROP initiative progresses, ongoing monitoring and evaluation will be crucial in ensuring its success and adaptability to the evolving needs of the community.

We remain dedicated to working hand-in-hand with our community to ensure progress and a better quality of life for all. Together, we are building a stronger, more connected municipality.




HANDING OVER OF WATER TREATMENT PLANT BY HON MIN PEMMY MAJODINA

Promoting Road Safety: Festive Season Traffic Operations in Full Swing

The Dr. Beyers Naudé Local Municipality, in collaboration with the South African Police Service (SAPS), has been conducting intensified traffic control operations to ensure the safety of all road users during the festive season. These efforts included visible patrols and roadblocks aimed at promoting compliance and reducing traffic violations.

During the operations, 2,760 vehicles were stopped and inspected, resulting in 178 Section 56 notices issued for various offenses. Despite these proactive measures, the municipality has recorded 22 accidents, with the majority involving public transport vehicles. Tragically, 24 fatalities were reported, including five lives lost in a single incident on Monday, January 13th 2025, between Aberdeen and Graaff-Reinet.

To further enhance road safety, the municipality urges motorists to drive responsibly, adhere to traffic regulations, and exercise extra caution, especially during this high-traffic season.


