

ABD: Any new developments on municipal land next to N9 By-pass in Aberdeen can only be considered once proposals with a detailed business plan and site development plan from Developers are received, upon which the matter will be referred to Council and the relevant Government Departments for consideration.

D.E&P: A fully integrated Spatial Development plan is required for planning purposes. Funding has been requested from Rural Development and MISA. Once planning has been completed the Council will have to decide on the development of the land, private or public.

SPU: With regards to the Youth Development Centre, the SPU Officer liaised with the Area Manager to convert a part of the Sopkombuis into a Youth Development Training Centre. Dept Rural Development has already allocated computers and CDW workers assisted with renovations, but unfortunately plans were stopped due to the current state of the Sopkombuis. Other alternatives will have to be investigated. NYDA visited Aberdeen a few weeks back and will provide young people with entrepreneurship training which will enable them to start their own recycling business.

#### THERE ARE TWO OTHER DEVELOPMENTS THAT THE COMMUNITY NEEDS TO TAKE NOTE OF:

#### Fonteinbos

This project did not achieve its desired outcome and has stalled on a number of occasions. It requires urgent and focussed attention.

2018: WARD COMMITTEE: a proposal by two farmers has been received and he will be meeting with them soon. A document was distributed. There is movement. 2019: Mr Kosi from DEDEAT was there recently and very disappointed to see the state that Fonteinbos is in. Municipality should consider rezoning it for agricultural use (deproclaimed?). Mr Roelof v/d Merwe still to give presentation to Management.

#### 2. Uranium Mining

There has been an indication that the Mining Company will provide employment and training opportunities for Aberdeen, with social responsibility benefits, such as possible funding of socio-economic infrastructure.

2018: WARD COMMITTEE: Company/ies have withdrawn. Process was flawed. New process is being considered.

NO PROGRESS !! What is future of Tourism function – will it be performed in-house or outsourced? Will suitably qualified and experienced Officials be appointed to these positions – either through advertising or placement.

#### ADDITIONAL INPUT OR REPORTING BY MUNICIPAL OFFICIALS

LED: Business Incubator concept was informally researched and proved not to be feasible due to lack of skills in the area, the LED Unit together with the Camdeboo Business Forum then appointed a service provider to develop a Skills Development Centre Concept Plan to improve these skills. The document was finalised and tabled to Management. Funding is to be sourced with the assistance of the private sector to implement this concept.

#### STATUS OF OTHER IMPORTANT ISSUES IDENTIFIED DURING THE 2016 CBP WORKSHOP

Road traffic signs and markings on Municipal streets require maintenance. No improvement. Street markings have virtually disappeared on road surfaces in some areas and in other places signboards have been damaged (by vehicles or vandalized) or removed. Repeated requests to attend to this problem have fallen on deaf ears. Was told that there is no paint, but this is not an acceptable excuse.

2018: WARD COMMITTEE: No progress. Fix road (e.g. potholes) and repaint road markings and road traffic signs.

2019: No improvement.

■ There is inadequate and inconsistent building control and law enforcement.	No improvement. There is inadequate and inconsistent building control and law enforcement. There is ALMOST NO LAW ENFORCEMENT. The issue of the illegal car guards continues to be a nightmare for most residents and tourists, the hawkers outside the Shoprite stretch continue to exacerbate the problem of bag snatchers etc. 2018: DE&P: Building control is being exercised.  2018: WARD COMMITTEE: illegal car guard situation has been improved, thanks to Brig. Adolph / SAPS. Hawkers – more specifically their hangers-on and loiterers – continue to be a threat to shoppers. The hawkers are trading goods for other businesses, which is unfair to the businesses in front of whose premises they are selling these goods – on behalf of a third party. This should be investigated and regulated. Also look at cnr of Bourke & Caledon Streets. LAW ENFORCEMENT!!  2019: Situation has deteriorated. SAPS is trying its best, but no law enforcement from side of Municipality.  2019: The Heritage Society is meeting regularly with the Municipality.
Illegal dumping & littering; vandalism and general state of the Ward.	Community Services Dept is doing their best, but without proper law enforcement, the problem will not be solved. The problem is particularly bad along the Wolwas road, in the neighbouring Ward. There are insufficient bins in public spaces. There are inadequate public toilet facilities and people are urinating and defecating everywhere, sometimes in full view of the public (especially on pension & grant pay-out days).  2018: WARD COMMITTEE: Manage waste management service more effectively. More public toilet facilities are required (e.g. parking area behind the Town Hall) and existing ones must be better maintained. Environmental Health Officers need to roll out aggressive educational campaigns and report on their progress. LAW ENFORCEMENT!!
Water leaks in certain areas must be attended to and infrastructure maintained.	There has been some improvement, with long-outstanding problem areas having been addressed, but there are still big problems in Park Street, requiring urgent attention. Sidewalks in the whole Horseshoe area are in a shocking condition, and pose a real danger to pedestrians. Injuries caused as a result of uneven and broken paving will result in claims against the Municipality.  2018: DE&P: Water leaks are repaired on a regular basis. Sidewalks are repaired as and when damaged.  2018: WARD COMMITTEE: problems to a large degree have been resolved. There should be regular media articles on water saving measures and urging the public to report water leaks. Standard of repairs to sidewalks is not good and more attention is required with concrete slabs over stormwater outlets and furrows.  2019: Situation has deteriorated drastically.
The increasing Grant Dependency (which includes exploitation of the system), is a growing concern.	The dependency continues to grow. Councillors need to be very investigative and discerning when doing their indigent (IGG Support) visits (i.e. in determining whether the household qualifies or not). There was an incident where an applicant actually stated that they took a chance!  2018: WARD COMMITTEE: very strict monitoring is done by Ward Cllr.  2019: This is still a concern.

Children's playparks in the Ward require upgrading, maintenance & repair or replacement of equipment, grassing & refuse bins Community Services Dept has been very co-operative in attempts to improve the situation. Benches in Angel Park were painted, lawns trimmed and general tidying-up was done. Littering remains a problem.

Residents have done extensive work at the playpark cnr of West & Cradock Streets. Artificial grass has been donated. Bin still needs to be provided.

2018: WARD COMMITTEE: Community Services need to clean the Park/s more regularly. Van Rhyneveld Square's Park requires cleaning and maintenance.

2019 : Municipality to investigate maintenance of Park Str playpark. Is this not funded through a Trust?

Social problems (e.g. poverty, substance abuse, high crime rate, school drop-outs, teenage pregnancies, etc.) are serious concerns. No improvement. School drop-outs in Nieu-Bethesda is a BIG problem as parents do not find the money to send the kids to High School in Graaff-Reinet. NO TRANSPORT.

No improvement. Depts of Social Welfare, Health, Education and SAPS must work together to address these problems.

2018: WARD COMMITTEE: has spoken to learners at Lettie De Klerk School to inspire them and give them hope. Other social problems in Nieu-Bethesda: there has been improvement in crime, thanks to W/O Van Rooyen and he has made inroads on the substance abuse problem in addressing drugs coming into NB.

A way must be found for some corporation to sponsor a bus for learners. Dept Social Development is spending more time in NB.

2019: Social woes continue to escalate.

#### ADDITIONAL COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE-LISTED ISSUES

Nine new Police Officers have been earmarked for Nieu-Bethesda SAPS, but housing for them is a problem. (Do the Police Barracks still exist behind the Station Commander's house? How many Officers can be accommodated there? Possibility of accommodation being provided by Dept. of Roads & Public Works?)

2018: WARD COMMITTEE: Cllr Botha will be attending CPF meeting soon and try to establish what current situation is.

2019: This station is in the process of being upgraded to a 24-hour service. Manpower has been increased.

Hawking in Caledon Street is not being controlled or policed and has extended as far as Standard Bank and other places within CBD.

2018: MPS: Law enforcement, SAPS and NPA are still working on the hawkers challenge. However, NPA have indicated that Council needs to address the issue of availability of hawking sites for the hawkers first in order to have an impact on enforcing the by-laws.

2019: No improvement.

🕨 Illegal car guards (especially in Caledon & Church Streets) are a serious problem. Cllr Graham has apparently submitted a motion in this regard.

2018: MPS: SAPS have issued section 56 notices but they were not paid by the offenders. However, NPA have issued warrants for arrest and we await the outcome of such. In the meantime we have made a list of all operating "guards". However, we are having a challenge as our Law Enforcement Officers only work during office hours.

2019: Situation has worsened.

Illegal taxi operators and those transgressing the road traffic laws are a CRITICAL problem, requiring URGENT intervention.

2018: MPS: We have enforced the relevant legislation and after withdrawal of the issued section 56 notices, we managed to have discussions on the issue with NPA and their interpretation of operating without an operating licence differs. However, the traffic officials are working as per scheduled planning, as we have other traffic related issues also to address.

WARD COMMITTEE: A Ward Committee Member (?) has met with several parties to have this problem addressed. LAW ENFORCEMENT!! Can SANRAL / Dept Roads & Transport not designate stop & go taxi bays to alleviate the problem?

The Ward Committee reiterated that Law Enforcement was inadequate or non-existent and required URGENT intervention.

2019: Situation is now worse than ever! The Demerit System must be implemented without delay.

2018 & 2019 : War Room is not functioning.

#### IN ADDITION, IN 2018 THE MPS REPORTED:

- Traffic Control in respect of speeding offenders at identified spots: According to the CBP map, the request is that speed measurement should be conducted in Somerset Street and Middle Street during peak hours. Unfortunately, due to shortage of manpower, we can only do planning on daily traffic control duties to be visible in Church Street and College Road during peak hours, as the need arises. However, strategic planning in respect of speed measurement will be done during Monday mornings and Friday afternoons in Stockenström Street.
- Traffic Control in respect of pedestrian crossings: I believe we should not generalise the issue as our surveys indicate that some pedestrians generally do not use the sidewalks anymore. I have requested that our traffic officials should start with a traffic safety awareness campaign at schools as a matter of urgency. I have also noticed there are educational and informative columns in the Advertiser each week (e.g. Jenny Street and Amos Mcinga) and it would be a good idea for the Municipality to do something similar. Council also need to resolve that a bi-weekly traffic safety notification be placed as it is a national challenge in respect of pedestrian education.
- Law Enforcement in respect of inadequate building control and enforcing the by-laws on the illegal tourism signages in Nieu-Bethesda and Graaff-Reinet CBD:

  Unfortunately the administering of this scope of work totally collapsed after the resignation of the Building Control Officer a few years ago. She and the Law

  Enforcement had previously worked hand-in-hand to curb these illegal activities. However, the relevant directorates should work out a plan of action as soon as possible to issue the necessary non-compliance notices, whereafter Law Enforcement will issue section 56 notices on the transgressors.

2019: The Ward Committee stressed the importance of the Traffic Dept / Protection Services being adequately staffed and capacitated to fulfil their functions and duties.

Regarding the Ward Committee monthly reports: the new consolidated format (putting issues of all 14 Wards together under one heading) is not working.

Administration to relook format so that Ward Councillors are in a better position to check progress on their Ward's issues and provide clear feedback to their Communities.

## **STATUS 2019**

LED: No progress made as yet for the Mini shopping centre. Will consult with the Planning unit for a possible site that can be allocated to this initiative. The site available currently is said to be earmarked for a Multi-purpose centre. Investigations have been conducted. Two small sites adjacent to each other (can be merged into one site) have been identified as vacant for any earmarked development in the new housing area, erf 8034 and 8035. Will have to be rezoned. The Planning Unit has advised that a mini complex should be developed due to possible traffic challenges. The recommendation is that a Site Development Plan should be developed and then advertised for Expression of Interest for possible private investment.

Dysfunctionality of the LED Unit to be referred to the Municipal Manager for comment, however the LED Office has been fully operational since 2010 and continues to provide services to the community as per their mandate. The recent LED Training workshop for Councillors held in Graaff-Reinet on 07-08 August 2019 confirmed this perception of dysfunctionality not to be true, and rather a lack of understanding of the concept of Local Economic Development.

#### STATUS OF OTHER IMPORTANT ISSUES IDENTIFIED DURING THE 2016 CBP WORKSHOP

■ High levels of unemployment in the Ward.

No improvement. Skills Development and Job Creation programmes must be stepped up. 2018 WARD COMMITTEE: SPU must actively promote training for semi-skilled persons and link youth to training programmes. There is a big need for this in the Ward.

	2019: LED: Youth should also play a pro-active role in coming up with possible entrepreneurial ideas that the Municipality can try and assist with. Local Government in its primary role is not responsible for Job creation, private sector is. A skills development Concept Plan has been developed and tabled to Management for comments.
Illegal dumping & littering; vandalism and general state of the Ward.	There is regular cleaning in the Ward, but people are still littering and dumping; buildings are being vandalized – this can be ascribed to poor police visibility and inadequate to non-existent law enforcement. Municipality and SAPS must take firm action against transgressors. Cleaning and greening programmes must continue, as well as educational anti-littering and environmental protection campaigns.
Inadequate Primary Health Care facilities; lack of skills development and proper recreation facilities for the Youth are serious concerns.	No improvement. SPU must please see what other programmes or facilities can be provided for the Youth.  Dept of Health must urgently deal with the Primary Health Care needs of the Community.  2019: SPU: we can only do so much without a proper budget. Depts of Social Welfare, Health and SAPS must work together to address these problems.  2018: WARD COMMITTEE: the only Social Worker that they are aware of, is based at GRT Primary and works only with school children. Fieldworkers & house visits are an urgent need. Some families are living in dire circumstances and children are suffering in these poor conditions – underfed and not properly clothed. Old people as well.  2019: there is a Social Development Forum and Ward Committee members serve on it. They requested Social Workers to visit the Ward, but to date no show. The Dept is invisible in the Ward.  2018: Slow response time from SAPS and Ambulance Service.
	ADDITIONAL COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE-LISTED ISSUES

- Sector Departments must pay urgent attention to the issues that are their function; it is not all the Municipality's responsibility.
- The absence of War Room members and Sector Departments at the meeting was a matter of concern, as expressed by the Ward Councillor. 2018 & 2019: The War Room is not functional.
- ▶ 2018 : There is a problem with how their monthly reports are being dealt with : non-response. Ward Co-ordinator did have a system in place and a template was populated, but no feedback is being received and no-one knows what was done to address issues.
  - 2019: The way the report is being consolidated is not working for Ward Cllrs. Their issues are getting lost amongst the others and makes it difficult to report back to their constituencies. The majority of Departments are not responding.
- ▶ 2019 : Kollie Koeberg is in a very neglected state. Vandalism is rife. Municipality must ringfence 15% MIG component and utilize for upgrading the facility. ADCS: The Municipality repaired the Kollie Koeberg stadium from the operational and maintenance budget. Additional security was put in place to assist with prevention of vandalism of the complex. Security lights were also installed. Furthermore, provision has been made in the 2020/21 FY for upgrading of Kollie Koeberg Stadium from the Municipal Infrastructure Grant.

### **STATUS 2019**

LED: With regards to No. 2 Shopping Mall: no suitable site could be identified and secured in ward 6 for the development of the shopping mall. Furthermore, it should be noted that Umasizakhe is basically land-locked, and land that can be released for New Housing, commercial and other developments is almost non-existent in this township; this is as a result of the original spatial planning, pre-1994 that can unfortunately not be reversed. Housing Development Agency (HDA) in partnership with the LED and Town Planning Unit performed a spatial planning exercise in 2015/16 financial year to identify vacant and available sites and ownership. The exercise revealed that the only vacant site is the one behind Vrygrond, however, it also has its own technical issues that need to be looked into.

D.E&P: The Ward Cllr is fully aware of the reasons why Vrygrond cannot be developed; it was discussed comprehensively at a Council meeting.

- Upgrading of Fire Service, through the training of local people that can be utilized / appointed as dedicated fire-fighting officers.
  - 2018: WARD COMMITTEE: This has been referred to SBDM Executive Mayor.
- SAPS / police visibility and presence must be improved by the placing of a satellite police station in the Ward.
  - 2018: WARD COMMITTEE: Referred to SAPS. Brig Adolph did report at IGR.

What has happened to the funding allocation for Steytlerville landfill that was promised by the Mayor? Boreholes were sunk to test for water and site needs to be fenced and properly managed. CWP workers are assisting with cleaning of the site, but people are dumping at the entrance and Correctional Services has been dumping building rubble. The landfill site is non-compliant.

#### ADDITIONAL INPUT OR REPORTING BY MUNICIPAL OFFICIALS

Area Co-ord: (1) Illegal dumping in Wolwefontein has stopped, (2) Municipal workers are collecting refuse every 2<sup>nd</sup> week in Wolwefontein, and (3) Community Services Dept is busy obtaining quotations for hire of bulldozer to clean landfill sites in BNLM – including the one at Steytlerville.

#### ANY OTHER COMMENTS ON EXISTING PRIORITIES

- Waste disposal site in Steytlerville is deteriorating and developing into a health risk needs urgent attention and intervention. 2018 & 2019: URGENT!!
- Empty RDP houses are being vandalised in Steytlerville. Can these houses not be transferred to those with housing needs? 2018: PLEASE ADDRESS THIS ISSUE! 2019: Committee provided details in Ward Committee Report, but still no progress.

#### The following needs & issues were identified

- There is a need for a municipal pound. 2018: Manager of Community Services stopped the one that was operating. The matter requires URGENT ATTENTION. 2019: Ward Cllr constructed one at own cost and it was fully functional & compliant, but was closed down by Municipality. Stray animals are roaming everywhere, spreading parasites and disease. Area Co-ord: There is no suitable space for a Municipal Pound on commonage.
- Action must be taken against unlicensed taverns and spaza shops 2018: Land Use and License inspections by Municipality and SAPS?? There is no law enforcement or Police visibility. There is a serious problem at Wolwefontein, with a person who is bringing in bakkie-loads of liquor and selling on account. ACTION REQUIRED! 2019: No progress. No action by SAPS. Area Co-ord: SAPS or Municipality must be informed when the individual transporting bakkie-loads of liquor to Wolwefontein is on site. It is not practical for law enforcement to have to sit and wait for the person to arrive, not knowing when he will be in Wolwefontein.
- There is a need for public toilets and benches in town area (Steytlerville) 2018: Community Services Dept to investigate and bring it into its planning. 2019: Can toilets at Town Hall not be utilized? Area Co-ord: There is no funding available for public toilets.
- Signage must be erected at town entrance from Willowmore's side indicating route to Port Elizabeth (from Steytlerville) SANRAL / DEPT. ROADS & TRANSPORT in consultation with the Municipality and the Ward Committee. 2019: NO PROGRESS!! Area Co-ord: A request was sent to Dept of Roads no progress.
- A cemetery and proper landfill site are required for Wolwefontein. TRANSNET to attend to this.

#### STATUS OF OTHER IMPORTANT ISSUES IDENTIFIED DURING THE 2016 CBP WORKSHOP

Signage is required for Day Care & TB Hospitals; street names and road traffic signs in general require attention.

No progress. Dept of Health to attend to this.

2018: MPS: Road traffic signs will be placed on backlog list, as no funding has been allocated for any trafficrelated projects for the past 3 years. Street name boards were erected in 2015/16. Directional information signs are the responsibility of the Sector Departments and must be referred to Dept of Public Works & SANRAL (e.g. for PE/Asherville intersection).

WARD COMMITTEE: Pedestrian crossings are an urgent need in front of schools in Bree & Narsing Streets. 2019: Day Hospital board must be replaced.

High levels of unemployment in the Ward.	No improvement. Still a major problem. The Municipality must continue and step up its support of EPWP and CWP programmes, and investigate other Job Creation initiatives that will assist in poverty alleviation.  2018 & 2019: Projects or programmes in Ward 14 must cater for the unemployed people from the Ward and not from other Wards.
Illegal dumping & littering; vandalism and general state of the Ward.	No improvement. Municipality is cleaning sporadically, but the situation remains problematic and hazardous conditions exist. The community must come up with a solution to assist in addressing the problem.  2018 & 2019: Environmental Health Officers must run with educational campaigns in the Ward. Inspections must be conducted at spazas and shops who are selling products that are rotting and long past their sell-by dates. Waste Management must improve.
Inadequate Ambulance & Police services; lack of skills development and proper recreation facilities for the Youth are serious concerns.	No improvement. The responsible Departments must attend to this as a matter of urgency.  2019: Only two vehicles providing an ambulance service for the whole area. Shortage of manpower.  SPU and LED Units to investigate what programmes or projects can be implemented in the Ward for the Youth.  2018: WARD COMMITTEE: SPU & LED are not visibly active in the Ward. When there are events, they receive very late notice and it is very disorganized.  2019: SPU: Unfortunately, due to limited funding, the SPU relies mostly on Government Departments for events or programmes and cannot take liability for dates and plans in advance.
Social problems (e.g. poverty, substance abuse, high crime rate, school drop-outs, teenage pregnancies, etc.) are serious concerns.	No improvement. Depts of Social Welfare, Health and SAPS must work together to address these problems. 2018 & 2019: Social Workers are not seen in the Ward – they are invisible. No fieldworkers or house visits. What are they doing to earn their monthly salaries? They must visit schools and attend to cased in various Wards. Dept of Education must pay attention to the situation in their schools. It is serious! Many pregnant girls are under age and this aspect is not being addressed. It is alleged that Mimosadale is recruiting school-children to herd livestock (slave labour?).

#### ADDITIONAL COMMENTS ON THE ABOVE-LISTED ISSUES

- The Community is extremely concerned about the deteriorating conditions in the Ward. Urgent intervention was required. PLEASE PAY ATTENTION TO THIS!
- ▶ 2018 : WARD COMMITTEE : What is the situation in Dept of Community Services? The Ward is not receiving services from this Department.
- The Ward Committee is extremely dissatisfied about the ineffective or non-existent law enforcement; illegal spaza shops are still operating and illegal littering and dumping is rife in the Ward. There is no visible law enforcement.
  - 2018: WARD COMMITTEE: LAW ENFORCEMENT!! 2019: Not all Spazas are being charged business tariffs. There are too many taxis are they operating legally with valid PDPs and permits?
- → 2018: WARD COMMITTEE: FIRE-FIGHTING SERVICE: Slow response time; trucks arrive without water and service is chaotic and disorganized. Segregation of functions and filling of posts is an absolute necessity.
   2019: The service requires urgent upgrading. Mr Rhoode to update Committee on status of station & posts.
- ▶ 2019 : The Ward Cllr submitted a proposal to COO for utilization of R100,000 per Ward allocation. What has happened to it? Committee also wants a breakdown of exact CAPEX spend on projects per Ward.
- 2018 & 2019 : War Room not functioning.
